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Meals on Wheels

Meals on Wheels (MOW) of Northeast Tennessee provides nutritious meals to the elderly ages 60+ and disabled ages 18-59. Meals are delivered Monday-Friday. All meals meet USDA guidelines and every recipient is assessed by the Aging and Resource Connection. Community meal sites also provide meals throughout the week in a group setting.

Senior Community Service Employment Program

Senior Community Service Employment (SCSEP) is a federally-funded training program that assists low-income, unemployed seniors gain viable job skills through paid training. Individuals must be unemployed, ages 55 or older, living in one of FTHRA's servicing counties and in a specified low income bracket.



Personal Support Services

The Personal Support Services (PSS) program provides personalized supportive services to clients in their home. Some examples of the services provided are meal prep, grocery shopping, house cleaning, laundry services, and etc. Services are designed with the intent to stabilize and maintain individuals in their own residences to let them age in place.



Child Care Food Program

The Child Care Food Program (CCFP) provides financial reimbursement for nutritious meals and snacks served to eligible children enrolled in a participating daycare.



Adult Day Services

Adult Day Services (ADS) provides personalized care for adults who are physically, socially, emotionally, and mentally challenged, or frail due to advanced age. ADS provides stimulating activities including daily exercise and craft projects.



Foster Grandparent Program

The Foster Grandparent Program (FGP) provides volunteer opportunities for people aged 55 and older from all economic, educational, and social backgrounds to serve children and the local school systems. This program ensures that our seniors are given the opportunity to positively impact the lives of children in need of additional reading and math assistance.



Corrections Program

The Misdemeanor Probation Program (MPP) and the Alternative Community Corrections Program (ACCP) are designed to divert non-violent convicted offenders from incarceration by providing intensive supervision and structured rehabilitative services in the community.
